Improving our housing options helps everyone in our community.

Wellington County is mandated for growth under provincial legislation.

Growing communities welcome new businesses, shops, workers, and families which are good for all of us — economically, socially, and culturally.

Additionally, adults and families are choosing to stay in Wellington County. Retirees are down-sizing to more manageable accommodations. **Affordability is a critical concern.**

Single detached homes remain a mainstay for community housing here, however, we must have a diverse range of housing options for individuals and families to meet these needs.

40% of people who rent here need to spend more than the recommended 30% of their income on housing

In Ontario over 10 years home prices have increased **180%** while average incomes increased just **38%**



The median price for homes in Centre Wellington has increased more than 235% in 5 years



We can encourage more housing options:

Rental:



Low-rise multi-unit buildings.



Townhouses.



Additional Residential Units — homeowners can rent second or third suites, basement apartments, detached units, laneway homes, etc. (subject to local zoning).



Refurbished and repurposed buildings such as former schools or factories.

Ownership:



Low-rise condominium buildings.



Duplexes and Triplexes.



Townhouses and Stacked Towns.



Tiny homes (refer to local zoning for details).
