Schedule B Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The Study

The Bosworth Bridge (No. B007028) consists of a single span steel truss structure with a concrete deck over the Conestogo River. The bridge has a span and deck width of 40.1 m and 8.4 m respectively and was constructed circa 1949. The bridge is located on Wellington Road 7 in the Township of Mapleton, 0.8 km east of Wellington Road 11.

The Class EA study determined that the existing bridge has reached the end of its service life. Based on an evaluation of alternatives, a complete replacement of the structure has been identified as the preferred alternative. The study was conducted in accordance with Schedule B of the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment* process (October 2000, as amended 2015).

A Project File has been prepared to document the planning and decision-making process for this study. By this Notice, the Project File is being placed on the public record for a thirty (30) day review period from and including January 20 to February 19 through the County website: www.wellington.ca/bosworth

In addition, a request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (e.g. requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g. require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request.
