The Amendment describes the changes and/or modifications to the Wellington County Official Plan which constitute Official Plan Amendment Number 120.

PART A - THE PREAMBLE

PURPOSE

The purpose of the proposed Official Plan Amendment is to revise the Wellington Growth Forecast by updating the population, household and employment forecasts to extend to 2051 and revise related text as a phase of the County's municipal comprehensive review.

LOCATION

The Amendment applies to the entire County of Wellington.

BACKGROUND

The current County Official Plan forecasts came into effect in 2017 to conform with and allocate the forecasts which extended to 2036 and 2041 in the Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe (Growth Plan). Since that time, the Province approved an amendment to Schedule 3 of the Growth Plan that shows population and employment forecasts to 2051.

In September 2019, County Council authorized the Planning and Development Department to proceed with the County Official Plan Review, which includes a municipal comprehensive review (MCR) component under the Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe (Growth Plan, 2019 as amended). The Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing has advised that municipalities may choose to use a phased approach, which includes more than one official plan amendment, to achieve conformity with the Growth Plan. This is the second Amendment of the County's phased MCR.

BASIS

The Growth Forecasts in this Amendment are based on the Phase 1 MCR Report: Urban Structure and Growth Allocations prepared by Watson & Associates (June 2021, as amended January 31, 2022). The new 2021 baseline in OPA 120 is based on the Phase 1 MCR Report (2016 Census plus building permit data) and not the 2021 Census.

PUBLIC AND AGENCY INPUT

A Special Meeting of County Official was held in June 2021 for the Official Plan Review.

This Official Plan Amendment (OPA 120) has been informed by consultation on the draft Phase 1 MCR Report: Urban Structure and Growth Allocations which included:

- Technical Resource Team (TRT) meetings through 2021
- Ongoing discussions with Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing staff
- Virtual Public Information Centre (PIC) to present Draft Phase 1 Report in June 2021
- Circulation of draft Phase 1 Report for comment from June to July 2021 to Member Municipalities, Indigenous communities, agencies, members of the public and stakeholders
- Documentation of PIC and circulation in Planning Committee report PD2021-21
- Documentation of Municipal feedback in Planning Committee report PD2021-30
- Documentation of growth forecasts and allocations and feedback in Planning Committee Report PD 2022-07

The direct consultation for Draft OPA 120 included:

- September 2022 circulation to Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing
- October 2022 circulation to Member Municipalities, Indigenous communities, agencies, members of the public and stakeholders
- December 15, 2022 statutory open house
- January 12, 2023 statutory public meeting

In order to obtain public feedback, notification of engagement opportunities was provided through the project email list and website updates. Notice of the statutory open house and public meeting was provided in accordance with the Planning Act and advertised in the Wellington Advertiser. We received and reviewed 19 written submissions.

SUMMARY OF KEY CHANGES PROPOSED

The main changes to the overall County growth forecasts, relative to the current Official Plan are:

- The forecast extends to 2051 (current time horizon is 2041);
- Time intervals before 2041 are no longer shown, except to include 2021 as a base (this is being done because the Growth Plan no longer shows time intervals before 2051, and to provide flexibility for short and medium term work); and
- A higher percentage of population growth in Wellington will take place in urban centres (89% in 2051 versus and 82% in 2041).

The new 2021 baseline in OPA 120 is from the Phase 1 MCR Report (2016 Census plus building permit data) and not the 2021 Census. Household data by settlement area in the OPA differs from the Phase 1 Report as it includes "other units" such as movable dwellings (trailer, houseboat units, mobile unit) and other single detached (residence in a church, single unit above or attached to a store, etc.).

The Amendment also removes Special Policy 3.5.1 for Hillsburgh and Erin Urban Centres that is no longer necessary, as the Town has completed the Class Environmental Assessments for municipal servicing needed to determine the future growth for Hillsburgh and Erin to 2051.

Since the circulation of the first draft of OPA 120, the final draft was revised to reflect editorial changes to add the word "Primary" to Urban Centre references in Table 1 and 7 and put Puslinch and Wellington North tables in alphabetical order.

PART B - THE AMENDMENT

All of this part of the document entitled **Part B - The Amendment**, consisting of the following text constitutes Amendment No. 120 to the County of Wellington Official Plan.

2. **Section 2.2 Our Commitment to the Future** is amended by:

a) Deleting subsection 2.2.1 which states "Accommodate a total County population of 122,000 by the year 2031;" and replacing it with the following:

"Accommodate a total County population of 160,000 by the year 2051;"

3. **Section 3.1 General Strategy** is amended by:

a) Deleting the phrase "Wellington County will grow from approximately 96,000 people in 2016 to approximately 140,000 people in 2041. Wellington will plan for new housing, commerce, employment and services for about 46,000 new residents" and replacing it with:

"Wellington County will growth from approximately 100,800 people in 2021 to approximately 160,000 people in 2051. Wellington will plan for new housing, commerce, employment and services for about 59,000 new residents."

4. **Section 3.2 Projected Growth** is amended by:

- a) In the first sentence of the first paragraph, deleting the phrase "25 years" and replacing it with "30 years".
- b) In the second sentence of the first paragraph, deleting the phrase "C.N. Watson and Associates" and replacing it with "Watson & Associates Economists Ltd."
- c) In the first sentence of the second paragraph, deleting the number "82%" and replacing it with "89%".

5. **Section 3.5 Allocating Growth** is amended by:

a) Deleting Section 3.5.1 Special Policy: Hillsburgh and Erin Urban Centres
